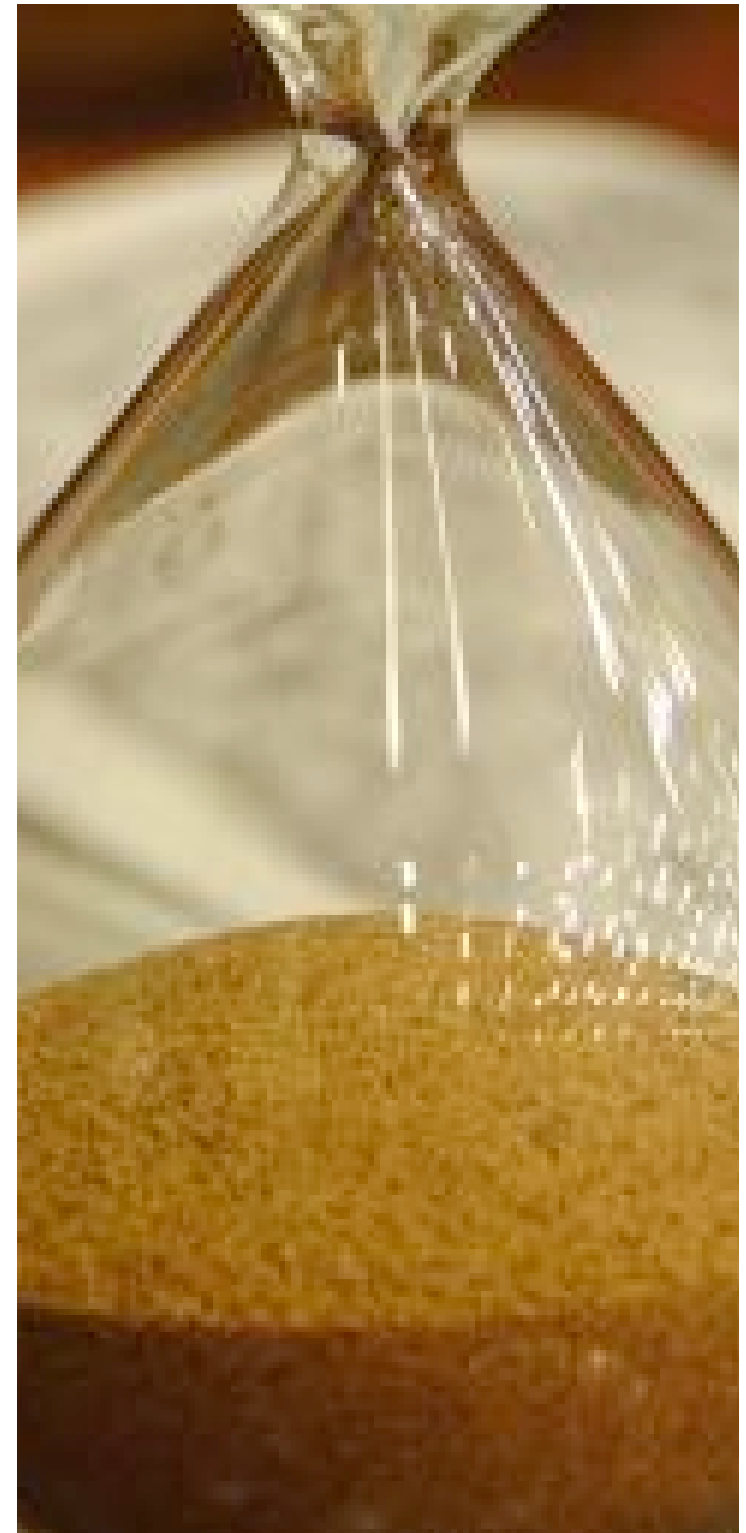

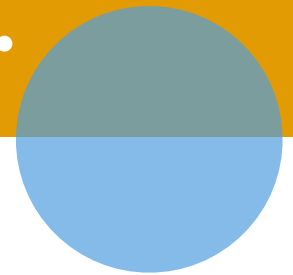

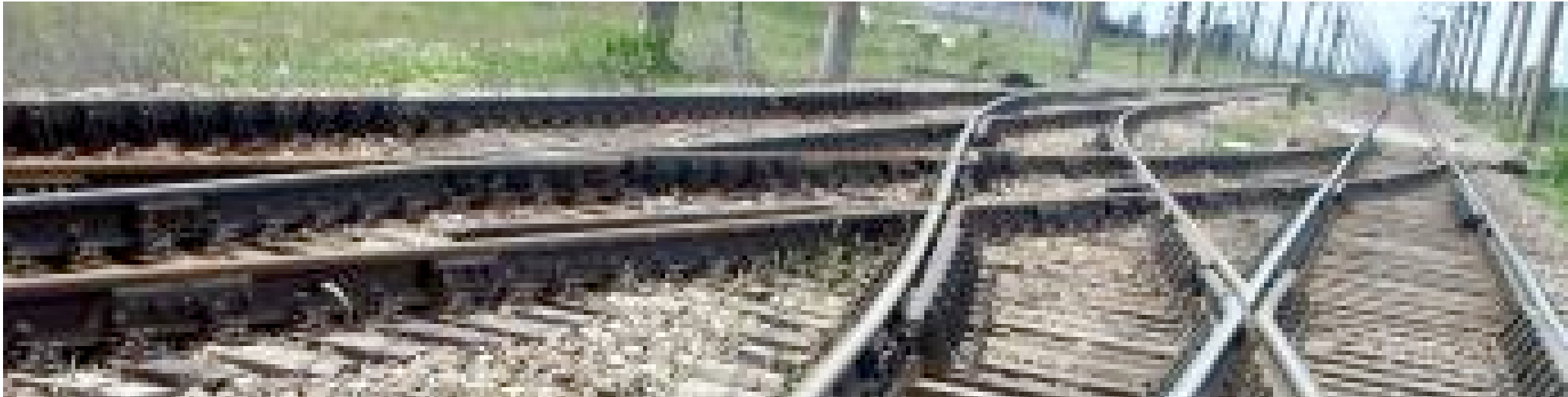
Communication starts with a right attitude and right motives.
